

Angol nyelvű összefoglaló

The current issue of Police Studies for 2026, in addition to introducing the participation of Hungarian law enforcement organizations in managing international crises in 2026, summarizes the crisis management activities of the Soviet Union after the collapse!

The studies cover the peacekeeping and crisis management activities carried out by the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), the United Nations (UN), European Union (EU), and the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) in the interest of the successor states, as well as the work (facilitating, mentoring, advising) that support democratic transformation and reforms.

The authors of the first chapter primarily present the international environment and security, political and social processes that have taken place in the territory of the Soviet successor states, and summarize the crisis management activities carried out there by international organizations (OSCE, UN, EU, CIS).

In the second chapter, we can read about the law enforcement missions that took place with Hungarian participation in 2025, as introduced by the participants.
